Election Dates

Primary Elections – third Tuesday in May, even-numbered years.

General Elections – Tuesday after the first Monday in November, even-numbered years.

County Elections – same time as statewide primary and general elections.

Municipal Elections – same time as statewide general elections

Special District Elections – second Tuesday in March or third Tuesday in May, odd-numbered years.

Special Elections – ballots delivered to voters in district by mail

Voter Registration

You may register to vote if you are:

- *A citizen of the United States
- *At least 18 years of age
- *A resident of Oregon for at least 20 days before the election

If you are a new resident in Oregon, you may register up to the 21st day before an election.

If you are already registered in Oregon, you can update your registration with a change of name and/or address up to the date of the election. However, ORS 247.203 allows changing your political affiliation only up to the 21st day before a primary election.
