## **CANDIDATE FORUMS SET**FOR APRIL 10, 11, and 12th

Candidate Forums will be April 10th at the Port Orford City Hall, April 11th at the Chetco Library, Brookings and April 12th at the Gold Beach City Hall. All Forums are 7 to 9 pm.

Participating candidates are: for County Commissioner #2, Jan Barbas, Andre Bay, Christopher Paasch, Jeri Lyn Thompson and for State Representative #1, David Brock Smith (R), Shannon M. Souza (D). At the time invitations were sent out there was a second candidate for the Republican Primary for State Representative but one candidate dropped out. There will only be one candidate for each party for State Representative #1 on the Primary Election ballots.

Each candidate will give an opening statement after drawing for speaker order. Once the statements are complete, a moderator will read questions collected from the audience on 3"x5" index cards. Each member of the audience will be given a card when they arrive or during the forum as questions arise. No oral questions are allowed. A timer will be at each forum to time opening statements and answers to questions. All forums will end promptly at 9PM. The public is invited to stay and meet the candidates at the end of the forums.

### **Aerial Spray Notification Process - Does it Work?**

The League of Women Voters of Oregon worked with Beyond Toxins, residents and legislators to develop a process to notify Oregon residents as to when aerial spraying will take place on private timberlands. How does the process work and is it working?

LWV of Curry County invited speaker Janet Moore of Coast Range Forest Watch to speak on the notification process (FERNS). 45 people attended the forums that were held in all three parts of the County. Also present was a representative from Oregon State Forestry who administers the FERNS program. Improvements have been made and residents can go on the State Forestry website for notifications and to register. Concerned citizens were also encouraged to contact timber companies and spraying companies listed by map site to find out more about how and when spraying will occur. At the Gold Beach meeting one of the Cedar Valley residents who lobbied to increase buffers and notification came and briefly spoke. He was encouraged by improvements that were made. The group felt that buffers need to be increased and water testing needs to be funded.

Climate and Salmon". The noon speakers are from our Curry Watersheds Partnership. We hope that all Curry LWV members will participate. There will be workshops throughout the day and members from all over the state to meet. We are still looking for a couple of volunteers to help register people Friday afternoon, Saturday morning and Sunday morning. Thank you to Anne Tlaker for helping organize this event!

This month we have our Primary Election Candidate Forums. It will be a little different this year as we will be hosting County Commissioner #2 candidates who are running as opponents in this non partisan election and State Representative #1 candidates who do not have an opponent on the Primary Ballot. Commissioner candidates must receive over 50% of the vote to win the non-partisan election or the top two candidates will have a runoff in the fall. More information about the forums is on page 1. June 2nd brings members to the final meeting of the year, our Annual Meeting. This year we will hold the meeting at the Soroptimist Building in Gold Beach from 9:30AM-1PM. #### FIRST CALL to COUNCIL 2018

Event Center at the Beach, Gold Beach, Oregon

Theme: "Watershed Moments"

COUNCIL: Council is the biennial state meeting of the League of Women Voters, held on alternate years to the state Convention. First Call is issued so local Leagues can begin to plan and discuss matters that should be presented at Council.

TIME AND PLACE: The 2018 Council will be held Friday and Saturday, May 4-6, 2018, at the Curry County Event Center, 29392 Ellensburg Avenue, Gold Beach, Oregon 97444. Early arrival is encouraged on Friday, May 4, as there will be a dine-around that evening. Council will begin on Saturday at 9:00 AM. Council will adjourn at around noon on Sunday to be followed by a state board meeting.

HOST LEAGUE: League of Women Voters of Curry County

PURPOSE: The following officers and directors shall be elected: Second Vice President, Secretary, and Treasurer for two-year terms and three elected Directors for two-year terms. The Council shall give guidance to the LWVOR Board on program, methods of work, and budget as submitted by the LWVOR Board of Directors.

The Council is authorized to change the program only in the event of an emergency upon recommendation of the LWVOR Board or a local League using the following procedure:

- 1) At least eight weeks before the Council meeting (March 9, 2018) any local League proposing a change shall submit it in writing to the LWVOR Board which shall decide whether to recommend it:
- 2) At least four weeks before the Council meeting (March 23, 2018) the LWVOR Board shall email to the Presidents of the local Leagues and MAL representatives all proposed changes;
- 3) Any change proposed by a local League and not recommended by the LWVOR Board shall first require a majority vote of the Council for consideration; and
- 4) The change shall be adopted by two-thirds vote.

The Council shall adopt a budget for the ensuing year and shall transact such other business as shall be presented by the LWVOR Board.

REPRESENTATION: In a council year, each recognized local League shall be entitled to two (2) delegates. Each approved State (MAL) Unit shall be entitled to one delegate. For those MAL members, not in an approved State Unit, MAL representation at council shall be one delegate selected as established in the LWVOR Policies, Procedures & Guidelines. If there are fewer than 10 MALs, the interest of the MALs shall be represented by the LWVOR Membership Chair. Each local League may designate the same number of alternates as allotted delegates. Any number of observers may attend.


