Your LWVCC Board chose an Economic Development topic for September's Unit Meetings. The Curry County Fairgrounds/Event Center receives no funding from the County other than insurance coverage for the buildings that the County owns. Therefore the Fair Board is updating the 1996 Master Plan in order to seek funding to renovate this important facility.

The County owned buildings are maintained thanks to the non-profit, Curry Fair Friends who cater events and donate all of the proceeds to the Event Center. However the Board is aware of major problems like leaking roofs. In order to bring enough funding in to maintain and improve the facility the Board is proposing an RV Park on the beach adjacent to the Conservation Zone as a possible project. There is a long list of projects the Board has developed of needs and public input is needed.

This past July the City of Gold Beach stepped forward dedicating 1% of its bed tax to the Event Center for projects to improve buildings that primarily are on Ellensburg Ave., Highway 101. Over the years Fair Boards and managers have proposed projects only to be rejected by voters or that never could happen due to lack of funding. With that said there have been improvements over the past 20 years; the old Museum is now a completely renovated Forestry Learning Center, all the buildings are painted, improvements to the barn area and general maintenance projects including new roofs on the outside stage and maintenance building. Thanks to help from the OSU Extension, the 4-H Dormitory has been renovated. The Board has retired a \$50,000 debt so it is now time for new projects.

How does the LWVCC fit in? Citizen Participation and Access. "The League of Women Voters believes democratic government depends upon the informed and active participation of its citizens and requires that government bodies protect the citizen's right to know by giving adequate notice of proposed actions, holding open meetings, and making public records accessible." *LWVUS Principles.* A small government body such as the Fair Board has very few people coming to its well advertised meetings and the Fair Board wants public input and participation. A display with a survey was set up at the Fair but very few people responded.

Due to the Fire Emergency in the south county Brookings members are asked to come to meetings in Port Orford - September 12 at noon at the Port Orford Library or in Gold Beach September 19 at 5:30PM at Gold Beach City Hall. Speakers will present a list of projects for citizens to comment on. Your participation is needed.
