Here's an excerpt from LWVUS President Deborah Turner's League Update, emailed 12/29/22:

- "2022 has been a groundbreaking year for the League and a wake-up call for our democracy."
- The League has "witnessed the rise in anti-voter laws, election mis- and disinformation, and poll worker intimidation," and it "rose to the occasion and helped voters turn out in record numbers to make their voices heard in a safe and secure midterm election."
- "Through these successes and challenges, we came together to build community and proclaim with our ever-resounding voices — every person has a right to have their voice heard, and every vote must


Are You a Future League Leader?

OREGON REDISTRICTING

From the People Not Politicians coalition: information and a call for volunteers.

- $ilde{ imes}$ The League of Women Voters of Oregon is part of and a leader of People Not Politicians (PNP).
- $ilde{ imes}$ For years, PNP has promoted redistricting reforms by initiative petition (IP), most recently IP 57.
- $ilde{ imes}$ PNP has refiled its redistricting initiative as IP 13 and IP 14 for the 2024 ballot.
- PNP is now preparing for the time it receives certified ballot titles and can begin gathering signatures in earnest (for only one of these petitions), probably in January or February.
- Part of PNP's plan is to mail a new petition to many of those voters who signed IP 57 two years ago.
- To do this, PNP has created an online process to verify the IP 57 signatures with voter registration records and add them to a database.
- PNP can then use that database for future mailings and other purposes.
- If you're interested in supporting this effort, please volunteer.
- You can do this volunteer work from home using your home computer and a website.
