

### **Great News!**

LWVCC has changed its IRS status from a 501(c)(4)to a 501(c)(3) charitable organization. The conversion process has been long and complex. It started with member approval at the annual meeting in June 2018. Six months later came submission to the IRS of the application, plus supporting documents and schedules (65 pages in all!). There were two follow-up submissions in 2019. The process culminated with

IRS approval in February 2020.

So how does the conversion affect LWVCC? As a 501 (c) (3), we are subject to strict expenditure limits on lobbying, though not on education.

Overall, we expect any impacts on our daily operations to be few and positive. For league supporters, it means that donations to LWVCC are now deductible to the full extent of the law. Here's that key feature in rhyme:

Now that we're 501(c)(3),
I pondered what it means to me.
Then it hit like a knuckleball:
Donations are deductible!
So now when I give my league
a gift, even my taxes may get a
lift – how swift!

A tax-deductible gift to LWVCC would be the perfect way to honor the League of Women Voters 100<sup>th</sup> anniversary this year.

### **Census 2020 Information Session**

On February 19th, Jim Graham, Partnership Specialist for the U.S. Census gave his only public presentation in Curry County about the upcoming Census 2020. Held at Curry Public Library, Jim was introduced by Jordan Popoff, librarian, who also welcomed the audience to the library.

The event was a partnership of the League of Women Voters of Curry County (LWVCC), Curry Public Library and Wild Rivers Connect.

Jim Graham explained about the Constitutional mandate for the census, its importance, (Money, Justice and Power!) what it is, timeline and the challenges to an accurate census. The private and confidential treatment of the data was also stressed, as the release of personal information is prohibited by law and punishable under Title 13 and Title 26.

March 12th is the date that postcards will begin to go out and the online and phone options to complete the census will go live. For the first time, the census can be filled out online.

April 1st is "Census Day", a key reference date for the

census. Efforts to contact those who have not completed the census will be from May to July. An accurate count is vital to services in Curry County which includes schools, roads, hospitals and local governments as well as community organizations.

Census recruitment efforts were represented at the event by Marion Roberts, US Census Recruiter and Jeanny Bulwada, Goodwill Employment Specialist. At the time of the meeting, 50 more census "enumerators" were still needed for Curry County.

Laura Hunter, Oregon Coast Community Action's (ORCCA) Census Outreach Coordinator was also present.

Georgia Nowlin of Wild Rivers Connect and League board member gave an overview about the census in their dates and times. Curry and the collaborative of Oregon's philanthropic organizations that are working to reduce the undercount in this year's census by funding the #WeCountOregon campaign to put Census Assistance Centers in every county in Oregon. ORCCA was


recently awarded the funding for the program in Coos and Curry Counties. Laura Hunter spoke about ORCCA's plan for outreach to the Hard to Count population and that they are actively looking to hire a part-time Curry County Census Organizer.

Mary Jane LaBelle, LWVCC president closed the meeting with information on upcoming League activities and a thanks to everyone.

### **Voter Services**

Charlie Alexander, our next voter services chairperson, has begun the task of setting up the Candidate Forums for Oregon's May 19<sup>th</sup> primary election.

The Forums will be held on April 13, 14 and 15 in Brookings, Gold Beach and Port Orford. Check the attached calendar for times and places.



Voter Registration Deadline is April 28! The races will be for National and State primaries and local County offices. Currently, there are two seats on the Board of Commissioners that are up for election.

Additionally, the County Clerk, Assessor, Sheriff and Treasurer will be on the primary election only if three candidates run for each seat. If three people do not run, the races will be on the general election Ballot in November. Candidate filing deadline is March 10, so we will know for sure who is running on March 11. Charlie and I have been entering candidates and the Gold Beach Ballot Measure 8-100 on Vote411. There will be Voter Guides for both elections, but Vote411 allows candidates and ballot measure pro and con statements to be entered.

Try out Vote411 when you receive your ballots! We are learning to better use this tool during each election.





## **Harvard Project**

Many of you may know about the LWVUS project to send high school social studies teachers from around the US to Harvard for a three day workshop last summer to learned about teaching critical thinking skills through the Case Study Method used at the Harvard Business School. The program was developed by a Professor David Moss as an undergraduate class at Harvard. It quickly

Became the most popular course at Harvard.
Phoebe Skinner a Pacific High School teacher, participated this past August and she will be facilitating a Case Study discussion for our community on

Tuesday, April 21, from 6:30 to 8:30pm at Curry Public Library in Gold Beach. Mark your calendar! Additionally, due to the success of the program it will offered

again and all local Leagues, including LWVCC, have called from essays from high school History and Social Service teachers in Curry County to choose the teacher(s) to attend the workshop this coming summer.

To be noted: Oregon sent the most teachers (13) of any state to this program last summer. There were a total of 70 teachers participating. As a result, the Oregon Department of Education has reached out to Professor Moss and plans are in the works to have a Case Study training here in Oregon in the future.
