

Bob Horel Speaks at April Unit Meetings

Curry County League Member Bob Horel spoke to all three Unit Meetings in April. Bob is Chairman of the Board of the new Curry Community Health organization (CCH). He described the nonprofit corporation which replaces the former Curry County departments of Public Health and Human Services, the government entities that provided mental health services to Curry County residents in need prior to the creation of CCH. As a cost-cutting measure the former County Commissioners (2009-2012) looked for a way to spin off the two departments. Not finding another entity willing to take over either or both, they decided to form the new corporation.

Horel said the board is excellent, with representation from all parts of the County and expertise in multiple fields. Board members receive no remuneration for their time or travel. They were appointed in the summer of 2012 and had to get IRS 501(c) (3) status, secure health care for employees, establish a line of credit and arrange transition of the 47 county employees to CCH. The transition went well and services are moving smoothly. Funding comes from state and federal sources, private grants and fees for services.

Public Health includes communicable disease investigation and control, environmental health, emergency preparedness, maintaining vital records (birth and death), family and children's and women's health and health education. Mental health and addictions services cover psychiatric crisis response and prevention, medication management and treatment, mental health court and jail services, case management, residential placement, and specialized services. Horel said there were 11,000 mental health visits in Curry County in 2012 involving 1,178 residents.

STATE LEGISLATORS HOLD TOWN HALL MEETING

Editor's Note: The following report is the combined efforts of League members Shirley Nelson and Georgia Nowlin, who were at the meetings in Port Orford and Brookings.

State Representative Wayne Krieger and State Senator Jeff Kruse addressed audiences at their Town Hall meetings in Port Orford and Brookings on March 29. They reported on legislation being considered after two months of the current session in Salem. After a few opening remarks, time was spent in conversation with audience members; questions were asked and answered regarding specific issues in legislation and came from people of various political views.

Kruse discussed the recurring issue with the Oregon Public Employees Retirement System (PERS). He is determined to solve the problem of it being too expensive for employers, especially in education. He is working on an alternate proposal and if it goes to court hopes to get "all the questions answered."

Kruse hopes all gun control measures being presented in the Oregon Legislature fail. Both men believe the main problem is mental health and mentioned some proposals for improving our state's mental health system. Krieger also mentioned some ways to cut prison costs such as not sending a parole violator back to prison; if there is a problem—such as drugs—the perpetrator should be helped. Older prisoners in poor health who are no longer a threat to society (such as sex offenders) should be sent to nursing homes rather than kept in prison.

Kruse is against any health care system operated by the government. He talked about Oregon's current and proposed health care and said Coordinated Care Organizations (CCOs) are so new that the Legislature will probably do nothing new in this session.

When asked about Senator Bates' bill to outlaw suction dredge mining on some Oregon rivers Krieger launched an argument that those "little dredges" don't do any harm to fish or anything else; turbidity is caused by other factors. He wants more research done to determine whether hatchery fish fare as well as native fish. He said a huge problem is the number of smolts being eaten by cormorants and seals, with losses estimated to be as high as 50%. He and other legislators are sponsoring a bill to address these problems.

Kruse chairs the Coastal Caucus and dredging of ports is at the top of their list. There is hope for the Port of Port Orford and others to get some help for their shoaling problem.

Krieger says he believes the next marijuana bill will be likely to pass, whatever it is. The state is looking at Washington and Colorado which have recently passed legislation. Both legislators are aware of the dangers of marijuana to our young people.

Most of the same issues were addressed at the Brookings forum. There Krieger talked about a bill he is sponsoring on grandparents' rights regarding children in the foster care system. He also mentioned the loss of county payments and the possibility of legislation that would allow counties and cities to file for Chapter 9 bankruptcy. Currently, there is no law allowing counties to declare bankruptcy.

CANDIDATE FORUMS APRIL 29, 30 AND MAY 1

Forums are scheduled for Port Orford, Gold Beach, and Brookings, on April 29, 30, and May 1, respectively. Shirley Nelson will moderate the first two and Maggie McHugh will moderate the Brookings forum. Brookings will have a split format as there are a large number of candidates. As well as four open positions on the Southwestern Oregon Community College board, there are four people running for two positions on the Port of Brookings-Harbor Commission, two running for Position 1 on the Harbor Sanitary District board and eight people running for three positions on the Brookings-Harbor School District board. We hope all League members attend the forum in their town. Their help in putting on the meetings will be appreciated.

LWVOR CONVENTION MAY 18 AND 19 IN COOS BAY

Our delegates to Convention at the Mill Casino in Coos Bay May 18-19, 2013 will be President Al Wilson and Director Genevieve Leary of Brookings. Linda Valet, Judy Fladger and Charlie Alexander of Port Orford will be observers. They will follow the theme "Looking at the World through League Colored Glasses." Program will be authorized, State Board and officers elected and budget approved.

Speakers will be Sue Allen of Our Ocean and Sarah Diefendorf, International Trainer for LWVUS, on her work in Jordan and Tunisia. Workshops on Health Care and Coastal Issues plus Help for Struggling Leagues and Leadership Development will be available. Readers Theater "Suffrage Succotash," which was born in Port Orford, will be presented at Dophin Playhouse May 17, 7:30 pm.
