The study's goals: The League will conduct an update of the League's position on campaign finance for the purpose of addressing the lack of member understanding and agreement as to whether financing a political campaign is protected speech under the First Amendment. The campaign finance position will be updated through a study and consensus process to consider: (1) the rights of individuals and organizations, under the First Amendment, to express their political views through independent expenditures and the finance of election campaign activities; and (2) how those rights, if any, should be protected and reconciled with the interests set out in the current position. "Consensus/group discussion is the technique most often used in the League for reaching member agreement. It is a process whereby members participate in a group discussion of an issue. The "consensus" reached by members through group discussion is not a simple majority nor is it unanimity; rather it is overall "sense of a group" as expressed through the exchange of ideas and opinions, whether in a membership meeting or a series of membership or unit meetings." Chetco and Mollala Move Towards Scenic Designation Peggy Lynch - LWVOR Natural Resources Action

Action: Today at the Water Resources Commission, a reach of the Chetco and a reach of the Mollala Rivers are one step closer to being added to the state's Scenic Waterways list. The League was instrumental in getting the state scenic waterways law passed years ago and we were involved during the first few years when about 20 sections of the state's rivers were designated. But the last designations occurred in 1988!

So during the 2013 legislative session, the League worked with others to push the Oregon Parks & Recreation Dept. to again consider new Scenic Waterways. Although there was no specific bill passed in 2013, Gov. Kitzhaber sent a letter to OPRD instructing them to begin the process of considering 3 reaches a biennium.

The League helped publicize the opportunity to nominate sections and 3 sections were selected for consideration. The third was a portion of the Grande Rhonde. I notified our local leagues and asked them to consider these rivers. After consideration, the Curry County League sent a letter of support for the Chetco (and Alyssa Babin was selected to serve on the local advisory committee) and the Clackamas County League sent a letter of support for the Mollala. The West Umatilla League chose not to participate as the river was a distance from their area of interest. There was a great deal of public process during this stage.

This week the Oregon Parks & Rec Commission recommended portions of the Chetco and the Mollala be designated as Scenic Waterways; today the Water Resources Commission concurred and determined the scenic waterway flows established for these sections. These recommendations now go to the Governor to sign off. (The Legislature CAN overrule this, so we will have to be diligent!)

FYI: I did orally appear before WRC today on behalf of the League in support of our local Leagues and the process. It was helpful for them to hear that the public process of extensive and inclusive. In this time of drought, any "set aside" of water for natural and recreational uses can be problematic. But these are upper reaches of these streams where little private property exists and where protecting the flows means that the lower reaches may well benefit from that set aside.

"The League, in conjunction with Curry and Clackamas local Leagues, supported the designation of portions of the Chetco and the Mollala Rivers as scenic waterways. The Parks and Recreation Commission and Water Resources Commission so designated."

(LWVCC President La Bonté is sending a letter to Governor Brown).
