VOTER FORUMS SCHEDULED FOR APRIL 22, 23 AND 24


Candidate Forums will be held Tuesday, April 22 in Port Orford; Wednesday, April 23 in Brookings; and Thursday, April 24 in Gold Beach. The dates were moved back from those previously announced to allow more time between them and the first mailing of ballots, April 30.

Letters have been sent to candidates for Curry County Commissioner, Position #1, and Circuit Court Judge, District 15, Position #6. Commissioner candidates are incumbent David Itzen, Randy Dowler, Jim Relaford, and Thomas Huxley, all from Brookings. The judicial candidates are incumbent Cynthia Beaman of Brookings and Shala McKenzie Kudlac of Sixes.

We will have a split format with the second half devoted to a discussion of the proposed Home Rule Charter measure. Speaking for the Charter will be Carl King of Gold Beach and expressing concerns about the document will be Larry Ball who has a business in Brookings. At this writing, Shirley Nelson will moderate in Gold Beach, Karen Jennings in Port Orford, and Al Wilson in Brookings.

VOTER REGISTRATION AT SWOCC APRIL 7 · 10

One of the oldest traditions in the League of Women Voters, going all the way back to 1920 when the Nineteenth Amendment was ratified, is voter registration. Those who have just turned 18 or are about to are great targets for these efforts. Southwest Oregon Community College (SWOCC) has asked our League to bring Voter Registration material to their campus during between April 7 to 10. Dear Members and Friends,

April has two activities that put our League into the public spotlight: our Voter Forums and Voter Registration efforts. The upcoming Primary Election figures to draw a lot of attention. In the Primary election we have three separate contests and all be covered.

One of our three County Commissioner seats is on the ballot with the incumbent and three challengers competing. The top two candidates will face off in November unless one of the candidates receives more than 50% of the vote. Another contest involves one of our Circuit Court Judge positions. The sitting Judge has opposition and this election will decide who will serve in that important position.

These two contests will take up the first half of each Forum using our traditional written question and verbal answer format. The second half of each Forum will be devoted to the proposed Home Rule Charter. Representatives of both the Pro and Con positions will be present to answer your written questions about this proposal.

We need League members at these Forums, not just because you are interested in the discussion but because we need your help putting them on. We need people to help set up and take down the chairs and tables. We also need people to gather and screen the questions from the audience. These are not onerous tasks but they are absolutely necessary in making each Forum run smoothly.

The second important function is the Voter Registration drive at SWOCC during the week of April 7. Studies have shown that once a person registers and votes they are far more likely to be involved in future elections. Getting these young people registered will make it more likely that they will stay involved in the democratic process. We need a few people to staff the tables for a few hours. Please contact Charlie Alexander if you can help.

FEBRUARY UNIT MEETINGS

Results of our League's program planning units in January have been sent electronically to the League of Women Voters of the United States to meet the March 1 deadline. Both Port Orford and Gold Beach units agreed to keep all national positions as presented. However, Port Orford members had questions about action on some of the issues and these were included in the report.

Specific concerns were in the areas of Trade, military contracts (treated under Privatization) and fracking which is not mentioned in the Resource Management area under Natural Resources. Members were concerned that the summary Trade statement says, "Support U.S. trade policies that 'reduce trade barriers,' 'expand international trade' and 'advance the achievement of humanitarian, environmental and social goals." The consensus was that the last three goals should come first, being more important than the first two. Some felt that private corporations should not be making profits on contracts with the military; soldiers used to get valuable training while in the service by doing work that needed to be done. That does not seem to be the case now.

All local positions were retained. Members in both units are wondering what is happening with recycling locally and whether the items we recycle actually get used and not just added to the garbage when out of our sight. Evan Kramer of Port Orford is looking into this. Gold Beach members urged our League to continue looking into how appointing of planning commission members and personnel evaluations are being handled by the Board of Commissioners. Gold Beach members are concerned about high populations of mentally ill prisoners in the County Jail and whether we could use State or National positions to do an investigation of the situation as an action item next year; or it could be a study for LWVCC.

February units heard an explanation of Voter Service and the activities our League does under that heading. Port Orford Unit had 14 people in attendance including two guests, one of whom joined. Four members will potentially be the core of a Voter Service Committee. In Gold Beach, four members attended, as well as Shirley and Milt Nelson from Port Orford. Those present agreed to help with the Gold Beach forum


