The LWV of Oregon adopted the following position on Civil Discourse:

"Promote civil discourse through action and education for all government bodies, staff, and citizens for the purpose of improved public policy decisions and processes. Civil discourse means, at a minimum, mutually respectful, courteous, constructive, and orderly communication."

February Unit Meetings

At the February Unit meetings South and Central County units decided to discuss hot topics. The North County Unit continued reviewing local league positions.

South County Discusses Gun Control

Board Member Judy Kaplan opened the February 21, South County Unit Meeting. She reported the following:

"The focus was on the Curry County Ordinance # 16-05 Second Amendment Preservation enacted Nov. 1, 2016. There was agreement that it would not be held up in court since the County government would not enforce laws, rules, regulations, etc. that 'infringe' on the County's definition of the right of people to keep and bear arms."

Recently there was a citizen request for an additional County Ordinance on gun control that Commissioners decided not to take up. They were being asked to override state and federal laws which legally they cannot do. If they try, they could lose state and federal funding. The requested new ordinance would also take authority away from the Sheriff.

Central County Discusses Plastic Bag Ban Proposal

Amy Timeus has been working on a proposal to ban plastic bag use in Gold Beach since March of 2015. The proposal has been evolving and still is. In its present state the bigger retail stores (McKays and Rays) would be effected. The City is checking with legal council to find out whether all retail stores would have to be included or can it be limited to the bigger stores. Timeus maintains that this is not a "tax" but a "fee'. If you check the definitions of "fee" verses "tax" she is correct.

The City did a survey of the original proposal. "The proposal would replace plastic bags with paper and institute a \$0.10 cent per bag tax with \$0.07 cents to go to the local school district. \$0.03 would be retained by the retailer for administration of the tax and for additional cost associated with the paper bags."

"Question #1: Would you like to see plastic bags banned and replaced by paper bags in Gold Beach? 61 - Yes, 64 - No, 19 - Maybe it depends on the particulars."

"Question #2: - Would you support a \$0.10 per bag fee with \$0.07 cents to go to a fund for the local schools? 56 - Yes, 76 - No, 13 - Maybe it depends on the particulars."

One suggestion Timeus is floating is to put some of the funds into an underground utility project the City is looking at funding streams for.

The League of Women Voters of Curry County is following this proposal as it evolves. We have a strong local league position on recycling. Plastic bags have been banned in other jurisdictions and there are a couple of bills floating through the legislature on bans of bags and plastic straws. We are looking for a member to follow the legislation to be sure that local bans already enacted take precedence regarding where funding would go. LWV Curry County Board Takes Position on Transient Lodging Tax

The LWV Curry Board took a position to support the Transient Lodging Tax (TLT) at our February Board meeting. On February 20, I read the following statement to the Curry County Commissioners. We heard a concern from a citizen who thought the commissioners might change the formula. The Commissioners supported a citizen committee proposal that the state mandated split 70% for tourism and tourism related facilities be split again. 50% of the 70% go to the County's Event Center on the Beach, and 50% of the 70% go to fund tourism related projects throughout the county. The remaining 30% under state law can go to County services and it was recommended that it go to the Sheriff to help with the impact of tourists on sheriff resources. Two commissioners agreed not to change the formula, one said he would likely not change the formula.

The League of Women Voters of Curry County has taken a position in support of the County's Transient Lodging Tax Ballot Measure based on the following positions:

The League of Women Voters of Curry County supports that alternative sources of funding should be explored for County government. The League of Women Voters supports a tax system that recognizes the individual's responsibility for government services by providing a broad sharing of the tax burden.

We do recognize that tourists put a certain burden on county government services and facilities and therefore, should share in the tax burden to provide these services.

The League has heard concerns that the commissioners might not abide by the distribution of the funding provided by the tax as outlined in the ballot measure. Certain percentages are in line with state statues and cannot be changed. However, we would like the sitting Board of Commissioners to commit to not changing the distribution that is voted on to assure trust in the County Commission on this issue.


