Mining at Red Flat?

The end goal of sampling for nickel and other minerals on National Forest lands up Hunter Creek and Pistol River would be to mine according to Obie Strickler, Geologist representing Red Flat Mining Company. LWVCC held three meetings on the issue. Speaking in Port Orford was Ann Vileisis President of the Kalimiopsis Audubon, in Brookings David Lacey, the Native Fish Society. The final meeting in Gold Beach hosted Lacey and Mr. Strickler who was invited to all three meetings. Vileisis and Mark Sherwood Director of the Southcoast District of the Native Fish Society were present in Brookings and Gold Beach as well.

Questions that came up in Brookings and Port Orford were asked of Strickler in Gold Beach such as how rain affected the mining activity, bonding responsibilities and clean up. Also asked were questions pertaining to the Riddle Mine closed in 1996 and what happens if there is an earthquake?

Ann Vileisis, author, speaking in Port Orford explained concerns that many groups opposing the mining activity along with Curry County and the City of Gold Beach. It was explained that there are two proposals located in Curry County, one at the headwaters of California's Smith River and the one up Hunter Creek/Pistol River. Most nickel now comes from Indonesia and the Ukraine. These areas are sensitive botanical areas as well as headwaters to Coho, Chinook and Steelhead bearing streams. Even though Coho is listed as a threatened species in these rivers the 1872 Mining Act trumps both the Endangered Species Act and the Clean Water Act and can move forward. The US Forest Service is the permitting agency.

David Lacey, 20 year resident of Hunter Creek and a fishing guide spoke in Brookings. Living on Hunter Creek he petitioned residents in the area and of those at home only one did not sign his petition opposing the mining. His concerns are for the economic impacts to fishing and tourism, central Curry County's leading industries. He also voiced concerns about possible contamination of the water source most residents use for drinking water. He said that the City of Gold Beach came out opposed to providing water for the sampling operations.



Happy Holidays:

With the holiday season underway we are participating in community bazaars as fundraising opportunities. November we had a table at the Gold Beach Bazaar and Dec 6 visit our table in Port Orford at the Senior Center.

In November we learned a lot about Nickel Mining and two nearby proposals. One on the Smith River in California that shares headwaters with the Chetco River and one in the National Forest at the headwaters of Hunter Creek and Pistol River, south of Gold Beach.

In January we will be having discussions of LWVOR positions, LWVCC positions and study recommendations. This will be a good time for members to recommend action to the Board on the Nickel Mining Proposals or a study if necessary. We also have many other good study topics in Curry County. Remember, if you propose a study you need a Chair and the ability to build a committee. Over the holidays think about what is important to you. It's your County. Join us for the fun events coming up and have a Happy Holiday Season!

According to Strickler the resource should be inventoried due to possible shut downs in countries where mining is now taking place. In the 1950s chromium was mined in Curry County and stockpiled in case of a national emergency. Nickel is used in creating stainless steel for medical supplies and for use in cell phones. One member of the public asked if there were any radioactive materials at the sites and he said "no". There is asbestos but not the form that is hazardous. He agreed it is better to mine in areas with lower rainfall but added mining is done in Indonesia and the Philippines where there are heavy rain falls. He said this would be surface or strip mined but Oregon has strict bonding and recovery laws. There would be no smelting but the minerals would be leach processed with sulfuric acid. His company has put up a bond for the sampling. He said some sampling areas had been moved due to environmental concerns and that the company does have to follow the NEPA permitting process. His company will decide whether to go forward or not based on economic gain. When asked about jobs he believes it will create jobs. He said moving forward is the end goal and even though many test sites do not pan out this one does have good potential due to the size of the mineral deposits. It is the quality and demand that will determine the future.

Lacey and Vileisis expressed concerns for fish, rare plant species, water quality and this wild and scenic area with free flowing (dam free) rivers.

At this time the LWVCC, LWVOR and LWVUS have no positions on mining other than opposing Marine Mineral Mining.


