## **October Unit Meetings Report - Hospital CEO**

Curry Health Network CEO Ginny Razo spoke to all three Curry LWV Units in October regarding the new hospital, what changes to services are coming up for Port Orford and the progress on the Emergency room for Brookings. The big news is that Port Orford will now have a doctor who will be taking appointments and there will be a time for "walk-ins". In Gold Beach we can see the steel structure of the new hospital, the tallest building around. The Emergency Room in Brookings is critical to having emergency flights out of the airport. At this time the Brookings facility is operating as an Urgent Care Center and is making a profit. Emergency Rooms do not make a profit generally. Decisions on the future of the Emergency Room will depend on funding once it is in. Razo explained the finances of the hospital in her presentation.

**The study's goals:** The League will conduct an update of the League's position on campaign finance for the purpose of addressing the lack of member understanding and agreement as to whether financing a political campaign is protected speech under the First Amendment. The campaign finance position will be updated through a study and consensus process to consider: (1) the rights of individuals and organizations, under the First Amendment, to express their political views through independent expenditures and the finance of election campaign activities; and (2) how those rights, if any, should be protected and reconciled with the interests set out in the current position. <u>Click on this link to the LWV.org site further information on this study</u>)

"Consensus/group discussion is the technique most often used in the League for reaching member agreement. It is a process whereby members participate in a group discussion of an issue. The "consensus" reached by members through group discussion is not a simple majority nor is it unanimity; rather it is overall "sense of a group" as expressed through the exchange of ideas and opinions, whether in a membership meeting or a series of membership or unit meetings."
