Redistricting Forum - November 20

The League of Women Voters of Oregon (LWVOR) has received a grant from the League of Women Voters U.S. Education Fund to create a program for state-based education and advocacy that aims to promote a reform to our current redistricting process here in Oregon.

The League supports redistricting reform that would promote taking the process of redistricting out of the hands of legislators and putting it back into the hands of voters to create fair and representative districts. We believe that voters should be choosing their representatives, not representatives choosing their voters. This reform would require an amendment to the Oregon Constitution to create an independent redistricting commission with strict criteria for drawing district boundaries. This is what the LWVOR and LWVUS redistricting positions call for.

The LWVOR is currently working with community partners to move forward with reform efforts and is reaching out to local Leagues across the state to hold public forums in the months of November and December about what the current problems are in our redistricting process and what reform could look like here in Oregon.

The League of Women Voters of Curry County will host a countywide meeting in Gold Beach at the Curry Public Library on 3rd Street, on November 20th at 1:30PM (so members from north and south county can attend). Candalynn Johnson, Program Chair will be making the presentation.

As with all LWVCC forums, this meeting is open to the public and the public is encouraged to come and participate!

General Election Ballot Measures - Statewide

The League of Women Voters of Oregon has been hard at work evaluating statewide measures, producing a voters' guide and speakers' kit for neutral education and arriving at advocacy positions as well. research. More information is coming your way - and you can find background online via the LWVOR website.

Measure 102 - Amends Constitution: Allows local bonds for financing affordable housing with nongovernmental entities. Re- quires voter approval, annual audits - LWVOR: Vote yes.

Measure 103 - Amends Constitution: Prohibits taxes/ fees based on transactions for "groceries" (defined) enacted or amended after September 2017 - LWVOR: Vote no.

Measure 104 - Amends Constitution: Expands (beyond taxes) application of requirement that three-fifths legislative majority approve bills raising revenue - LWVOR: Vote no.

Measure 105 - Repeals law limiting use of state/local law enforcement resources to enforce federal immigration laws - LWVOR: Vote no.

Measure 106 - Amends Constitution: Prohibits spending "public funds" (defined) directly/indirectly for "abortion" (defined); exceptions; reduces abortion access - LWVOR: Vote no.


